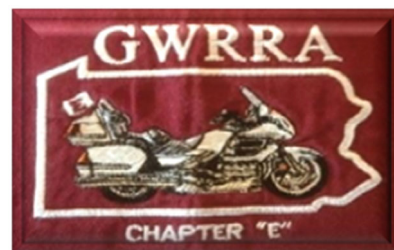

High Tech on a Motor Cycle

It can happen on any road, and at any time, so every road user must pay attention to driving, instead of his or her smartphone. Unfortunately, we do not live in a perfect world where everybody respects the rules, so distracted driving happens. The phenomenon probably takes place every day, on any given road.



The only thing that stops people from crashing their vehicles because of distracted driving, in many cases, is pure luck. That is the only thing that goes between someone getting home safe and arriving at a hospital with an ambulance.

Evidently, modern safety systems have curbed the risks a bit, but do not imagine that you are safe to take your eyes off the road to read or send a text message.

Using Facebook, or Twitter, or Snapchat, or whatever popular social app these days should never happen while you are driving. If you do this from time to time, just stop the activity while driving.

A vehicle is a dangerous object, even if you do not see it that way. Just think about it - a simple test, a stack of bills for a motorcycle, and you are on the road.

It is too easy to get a motorcycle driver's license on most bikes, and many people do not think that much about the responsibility that comes with it. Instead, they live in the bubble of "it is not going to happen to me," and they eventually crash. Some live to tell the tale, while others die or get scarred for life.

A motorcycle vlogger that goes by the username "Walterrific" has crashed his motorbike while using his smartphone. He used to tether his mobile in a dedicated stand on his handlebar, but he wanted to change the song that was being streamed into his headphones. For some reason, using the buttons on his headset did not work, so he took his eyes off the road and looked at his phone.

A few seconds after that, his bike crashed into a curb, right after a very smooth turn. The entire accident could have been avoided, along with breaking his collarbone, but he was not paying

Remembering Him Fondly



Since the accident last July, it was a very difficult struggle for Marty, and on April 6th, he finally succumbed to his injuries and passed away. At times like this, it seems appropriate to think about the person and their impact on those around him, so here are some thoughts I have about Marty.

“Slow and steady wins the race.” For anyone whoever rode with Marty, your first thought has to be the fast pace he never travelled. I can’t be sure, but I’d be willing to bet two chocolate chip cookies that Marty’s bike never exceeded the speed limit. I remember once travelling with Marty to a training class in Clearfield. I suggested he lead because I knew that my pace would not be comfortable for him, but he insisted that whatever pace I set, he would be good with it. Well, as I travelled down the road doing the speed limit, I found myself watching Marty becoming a smaller and smaller dot in my mirror. Even his son, Aaron, found it difficult to ride with his Dad. But it really didn’t matter to Marty, because “slow and steady always wins the race”.

Marty was the only person I knew who googled more than I do. When he and I would have conversations, about anything, there was always pleasant discussion dotted with intermittent pauses while each of us researched our positions. After we invested significant time and many keystrokes, we would always conclude that no world problems had been solved, but it was a lot of fun just trying.

And finally, Marty’s friendship will always be cherished. Don’t get me wrong. We never had any “band of brothers” moments where we charged into battle and triumphantly defeated the enemy. No, we were just friends who enjoyed similar activities and had the time to share them.

May is Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month

With warmer weather, it's time to remind everyone to be on the alert and to share the road with motorcyclists. Motorcycles are vehicles with the same rights and privileges as any motor vehicles on the roadway. All motorists are reminded to safely "share the road" with motorcycles and to be extra alert to help keep motorcyclists safe. Motorcyclists are reminded to make themselves visible to other motorists.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration devoted the month of May to Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month. The administration is encouraging all motorists to "share the road" with each other. Incorporating safe driving techniques helps reduce fatalities and injuries resulting from crashes and accidents. Over the past few years, the increase in motorcycle safety awareness has resulted in a decrease in motorcycle-related fatalities. Not only does safe driving decrease traffic incidents, it can also reduce insurance rates. Some companies provide qualifying safe drivers with discounts on their premiums.

Here are five motorcycle safety tips:

1. **Stay focused.** Motorcyclists should never ride while distracted. This includes using a cell phone, not paying attention to the road or talking to pedestrians or other motorists.
2. **Know your rights.** Don't let other vehicles bully you on the road, since motorcyclists have the same rights, privileges and responsibilities as all other motorists on the road. Conversely, in most states, motorcyclists do not have any special privileges.
3. **Wear a helmet.** This is the one of the most crucial components of riding a motorcycle. According to the NHTSA, an estimated 1,630 motorcyclists were saved by their helmets during accidents.
4. **Check your signals.** Many motorcycles do not have self-canceling turn signals, which means your signal will continue to flash after you've made your turn. If this is the case for your motorcycle, be sure to manually turn the signal off after a turn so as not to confuse other motorists.
5. **Avoid blind spots.** Since motorcycles are smaller than normal vehicles, it's easy to get lost in a blind spot. Although it's difficult to determine whether you're riding in another driver's blind spot, by avoiding the back corners of cars you can keep yourself safer.
